Listening and Reading:

- Google a famous person or group in history that you think made an important impact or motivated you.
 Here are some ideas: Mother Teresa, Danny Thomas, Habitat for Humanity, Special Olympics, Red Cross, or the Peace Corp

- To practice listening or reading at the word or phrase level, you can use pictures or logos such as Princess Diana (landmines) the Red Cross (give blood), Purple Heart (clothes). Match the name of the person / group to their cause or point to the one that is named. Again, this takes some work from a partner.
- Use pictures or logos or causes and match the group / person to their scandal or put the pictures in order from most to least favorite.

Talking and Writing:

- Many of the listening tasks above will also challenge your speech or writing.
- Discuss or write the answer to this question: In your opinion, what US President embodied the concept of leadership through service?
- Take some time to write a note about why the Center is important to you. Use your personal letter to ask 5 other people to donate \$24 on June 8 for DoMore24.
- Practice yes / no questions. You can practice full sentences, one word responses, thumbs up / down. Here are some questions:

- After a stroke, sometimes it is hard to find ways to give back. Here is a random list. Go through it and see if something appeals to you. Do it together!
- Donate food to a local food bank in your community
- Donate used books

- Pick up litter
- Randomly pay for someone's coffee or toll
- Give your grocery store points to a local school
- Say thank you to someone and tell them why you appreciate them
