In 2005, the Stroke Comeback Center opened its doors as the only non-profit organization in the DC metro area to provide affordable long term rehabilitative programs to stroke and brain trauma survivors. The Stroke Comeback Center provides programs for survivors with aphasia and other communication difficulties using a social approach. Our small group classes focus on all aspects of recovery: speech, reading, writing and comprehension, cognition and fitness. The SCC has received national recognition for our innovative programming and we serve as a model for other stroke organizations around the country.

We started with 12 members and 3 communication groups and 14 years later, we have grown to serving over 150 members and their families, providing over 8,700 service hours a year. While we continue to expand our membership and services, the need for support becomes more critical. As the SCC continues to serve as a vital resource for the community, we also maintain our mission to provide services at affordable rates and to provide scholarships to those in need; the SCC will not turn away a survivor based on ability to pay.
